

#### Sri Lanka Invokes War Status

COLOMBO, Sri Lanka - After putting the nation on war status, the Sri Lankan government gave sweeping powers to the military, police.and administration to deal with the Tamil rebel threat to split the country. Under the Public Security Act invoked by the government, Sri Lankan authorities can seize aircraft, ships or property without giving any reason, ban the publication of newspapers and leaflets that could harm national security, and prohibit demonstrations and strikes that may hinder the war effort.

#### Antimissile System May Not Protect Canada

HUNTSVILLE, Ala. - If Canada opts out of the U.S. missile defense project had a Canadian city were to come under missile attack, the United States might choose not to shoot it down, a senior U.S. military officer said. Vice Adm. Herbert Browne, deputy commander of U.S. Space Command, said that the United States wants Canada to participate in the antimissile system, which is being developed at an estimated cost of \$20 billion to defend all 50 U.S. states against attack from a small number of intercontinental ballistic missiles.
