





### The Life of Bari Ann Jones

Bari Ann Jones was born March 18, 1957 in Freeport Texas. At the ages of 10 Bari Ann gave her life to Christ. She was baptized at True Honor Missionary Baptist in Clute Texas, Pastor Anderson. She attends Lanier Elementary, Freeport, Texas; T.W Ogg Elementary School in Clute Texas. In 1969 the Jones family moved to Portland Oregon where she joined New Hope Missionary Baptist Church, Pastor A. Bernard Devers. In later years, Bari moved her membership to Berean Baptist Church, Pastor Nathan C. Barnett, Pld, OR. and served as a faithful and devoted member until he resigned and then under the leadership of Pastor Emmett Wheatfall. Where she served as a devoted member on the Usher Board; Planning Participant for the Berean 2000 Reunion; Vocational Bible School Teacher and other auxiliaries. She attend Martin Luther King Elementary and J.V. Beach Elementary, upon graduating from James Monroe High School in 1975 with honors. Then she continued her education at Portland State University majoring in Business Administration. Bari Ann Jones worked for Meier & Frank and stated working for the City of Portland at the age of fifteen afterschool in the Office of the City/County Justice Coordination & Planning. She worked at various bureaus over the years until being hired by Mayor Connie McCready in 1979. From 1980 until 1985, she worked for Mayor Frank Ivancie. She temporarily work for Mayor Bud Clark before going to work for Commissioner Jim Francesconi as the Commissioner Assistant until 1999 upon retiring.

At 21, Camillia Murphy is a mother, a wife, a homemaker and a visionary. As Camillia Murphy gently rocked her infant daughter Jaira, she reached for the navy blue, leather bound Bible that set amid mounds of paperwork that represent a command, Murphy says, she received from God. After watching her husband, Kory and Eric Knox, organize an urban youth Christian conference in October, Murphy decided

meet women who have something in common with you."

The conference, titled, "Woman to Woman 2000" will be held on June 23-24 at the Holiday Inn at the Airport. The theme of the conference is Proverbs 31:30, which says, "Charm is deceptive and beauty is fleeting. But a woman who fears the Lord is to be praised."

Some of the guest speakers include Leslie Hara of Western Seminary in Portland; Dr. Angel Smith of Detroit and Dr. Cheryl Burns of Colorado Springs. The gospel singing group Virtue will perform at the conference. To develop the workshop topics, Camillia said she prayed and tried to think about issues that impact women. Some topics include relationships, being a single parent and dating. The conference is for girls and women. The workshops for women and girls are separate. Early registration is \$35. Registration after June 15

is \$50. All proceeds from the conference will go toward the cost of the event. Murphy currently is paying for the conference through in-kind donations, fund-raisers and individual donors. Financial help is still needed, she said.

Camillia Murphy, whose mother lives in Portland, came to this city in 1997, to get away from her life in California. Murphy said her life of acting, modeling and money was not what God wanted for her.

"I want to give women in the Portland area a chance to get together and have fellowship outside their church life and be united as one," said Murphy, who attends Genesis Community Fellowship. "We go to our churches and to our Bible study. But this is an opportunity to network with women you may not know and to

said this isn't the life Christ has for me."

She attended church with her mother and began to see the changes in her life. "God moved me out here and out of my comfort zone," she said. "And I haven't been the same since."

Rather than focus on fame and recognition, Murphy has silently organized this conference with the help of friends and an assistant. She insists that the conference is a way for God to receive glory, not her.

As she finalized plans for the conference, she watched her 8-month-old daughter play with toys and simultaneously answered the questions of her husband, to whom she has been married for three years.

The recital will be Sunday, July 9 at 1:00 p.m. The church is located in

downtown Portland at 1200 SW Alder. His program emphasizes music of the Twentieth Century, and will also include several old masters.

David Higgs is one of American's leading concert organists, performing extensively throughout the United States and abroad. He is inaugurated many important new instruments including St. Stephan's Cathedral, Vienna; the Meyerson Symphony Center, Dallas; and the Church of St. Ignatius Loyola in New York City. Since 1987 he has played annual Christmas recitals to full capacity audiences at San Francisco's Davies

Symphony Hall. Higgs is also Chair of the Organ Department of the Eastman School of Music.

Dan Jaeckel, Inc., of Duluth, Minnesota built the new 52-stop organ. The organ took 30 months to build and another seven months to install in the historic church at Twelfth and Alder. Twenty different woods and over 3500 pipes form a striking and handsome addition to the beautiful Carpenter Gothic sanctuary. Tickets will be on sale through Fastix or through the church. Prices are \$10.00 for adults and \$7 for students.
