

Think you've seen it all at the unique daVinci Days Festival? Think again! There are new things to see everywhere you turn at this year's daVinci Days Festival, July 14-16 in Corvallis, Oregon.

New to the festival are events such as: the Guild Village featuring works created by regional artists; the daring feats and captivating treats of the International Street Performers Cabaret including tightrope walking, juggling and comedy; the Leonardo 500 miniature batterypowered vehicle race; a "Featured Filmmakers Program" with panel discussions lead by Academy and Emmy Award winning filmmakers; and the "Monument to Time" - a working sundial made of recycled

Leonardo 500, homemade, batterypowered vehicles the size of a shoebox compete in one of two categories, both of which are miniature vehicle versions of two popular races at daVinci Days. Choose from the flamboyant artistry of the Kinetic Sculpture Race (KSR) or the elctric cars built for the speed and performance of the Electrathon Gran Prix.

Vehicles competing in the KSR

category will compete on a 500 cm track containing obstacles of sand, water and roadway. Vehicles in the mini electrathon category will compete for most number of laps completed in the 500 second time limit. The races will take place on July 15-16, from 2:30 to 4:30 pm. in the Mainstage Field on the Oregon State University Lower Campus. FEATURED FILMMAKERS PROGRAM - Taking center stage during the daVinvi Film & Video Festival is the new "Featured

Filmmakers Program." Academy and Emmy Award winning filmmakers Allie Light and Irving Saraf will show their award winning documentary films, "Rachel's Daughters" and "In the Shadow of the Stars." Following the presentation of "Rachel's Daughters," the two will join three other panelists for a panel discussion on the film. On Sunday, the filmmakers will share their experience during their presentation of "The Art of Documentary Filmmaking.'

"MONUMENT TO TIME" Events will stay right on schedule thanks to the solar clock, a "Monument to Time." Artist Kiko Denzer returns to daVinci Days to create the sundial.

Denzer will use local and recycled materials, including sand, straw bales and poles. Costumed storytellers will perform near the sundial and will use the clock to

show elements of time in their stories.

Experience the "Monument to Time" from 10 am. to 5 pm., July 15 and 16 at the Oregon State University Lower Campus.

There's something for everyone at this unique festival celebrating art, science and technology, as inspired by Leonardo daVinci. Other daVinci Days highlights include: headliner music on three stages including a cool jazz stage; Oregon's only Kinetic Sculpture Race through mud, sand and water; the longest running Electrathon Gran Prix; plus a science and technology expo with an invention competition.

The whole family will love the OPB Children's village, and don't miss Sarah Susanka, internationally renown and award-winning architect and author, as keynote speaker. The daVinci Days Festival will be held July 14-16, 2000 in Corvallis, Oregon.
