### North Portland Bible College prepares for summer sessions

Whether one is puzzled by the various views of prophecy, want to get a "jumpstart" on his/her college education, or wants to become computer literate, North Bible College has something relevant to offer during its summer sessions on Tuesday and Thursday evenings from August 1 through 31.

In his course of the Book of Revelations, Rev. James Coleman will investigate various perspectives and provide the biblical background for each. Coleman is NPBC's popular instructor who spices his teaching with humorous anecdotes while he provides student with a solid base for Biblical faith. Pastor Emeritus of Fellowship Church of God has received recognition for his years of service as a chaplain at Emanuel Hospital in addition to his role as pastor.

On the same evenings, an "Introduction to Bible College" seminar, will be coordinated by NPBC's librarian and instructor, Beth Nance. It will include presentations by specialists in subject such as: How to succeed in college; How we got our Bible Study; History of English Bible; Introduction to Bible Interpretations; Inductive Bible Study; and other topics designed to give students a running start on their studies during the regular school year. The course is required for the Bible College's ACM (Associate's degree in Christian Ministry)

Meantime at the offsite computer lab in the New Hope Baptist Church Ms. Barbara Bilincoe will be instructing beginners in Windows 98 on Tuesday evenings and MS on Thursday evenings. NPBC continues to maintain its low tuition rate of only \$ 25 per credit hour or \$75 per course. The computer classes are 1-1/2 credit hours each. Registrations are being received by phone at the College office, 503-288-2919. Credit for courses in the ACM program are transferable to Warner Pacific College.

#### Portland's Rose Garden Will Host Thousands of Women for "Girls' Weekend"

Called "girl bonding with God's blessing" by US News and World Report, Women of Faith conferences have caused more than 1 million women to laugh, cry, and bond since it first began almost five years ago. In Portland, more than 13,000 women are expected to gather at The Rose Garden to meet God on a spiritual, personal, and practical level, for what Time magazine identifies as "both complement and antidote to the allmale Promise Keepers."

The conference runs from 7-10 pm Friday, August 25, and 9 am. - 6 pm Saturday, August 26.

More than 1 million women nationwide are finding through Women of Faith conferences a place where they can receive encouragement, insight, perspective, and hope for the future," said Women of Faith President Mary Graham.

"They learn that God cares about both their eternity and carpool!" Headquartered in Plano, Texas, Women of Faith was founded by Stephen Arterburn in 1996, and since has hosted 83 conferences with total attendance reaching more than one million.

The same six core speakers and some of today's best-selling Christian authors (Patsy Clairmont, Luci Swindoll, Sheila Walsh, Barbara Johnson, Marilyn Meberg, and Thelma Wells) will appear at each of the 24 scheduled "Extravagant Grace" conferences in 2000. In Portland, actor, speaker, and author Nicole Johnson will provide dramatic presentations that give unique insight on the joys and struggles of life. The award-winning group, Point of Grace, will be the musical guest for the weekend.

During the past five years, Women of Faith - the largest women's conference in the nation has sent an almost 1,100% increase in attendance, moving it into some of the largest arenas and coliseums in the country. Beginning with 36,000 women at seven conferences in 1996, Women of Faith hosted more than 375,000 women at 25 arena conferences in 1999. This year, Women of Faith conferences will fill arenas with 24 conferences nationwide. "Women who come say they would only change one thing - they would have brought more friends. And that's exactly what they are doing," said
