Beginning September 1, Oregonians under 18 years of age who apply for their first driving privileges will need to show proof of school attendance, completion of school, or exemption from attendance before DMV will

issue them a permit or diver license. "There are certain documents people can bring in to show they're in compliance with the law," said Lorna Young's, ODOT Deputy Director for DMV. "That includes a diploma or a GED certificate, a statement of

enrollment form from attending school, showing - in the words of the law- the student is making satisfactory progress toward a GED or a high school diploma.

If person is home schooled or is exempt from attending school, they also need to obtain the form through the school district or ESD.

applying for an instructional permit, a provisional diver license, a special student driver permit, an emergency driver permit or a moped restricted diver permit. It won't be necessary for someone applying for an

identification card. "A person will only need to show the form the first time they're issued a diver license or a permit," Youngs said. "If a person applies for a permit or a license for the first time after September 1, they need to bring it in for that transaction. That should be it, unless their license is cancelled, revoked or suspended for nonattendance at school.'

The law also gives Oregon schools districts and private schools the option to have DMV suspend the driving privilege of a student who withdraws from school. According to this law, a student is considered to have withdrawn from school if he or she has ten consecutive school days of unexcused absences or 15 days of unexcused absences during a single
