The ART & SOUL festival host more than 200 artists this year. Artists are returning from as far away as the state of New York. Artists are also represented form diverse areas of the Northwest.

Community Band are also performing. Entertainment is continuous for both days of the festival.

Thursday at Sunrise Bagles, 808 Harney (Next to the Columbian). This event is FREE and open to the public. The public is invited to attend and meet with up and coming Vancouver Artist Corey Boehler.


