February 28 In 1993, a gun battle erupted near Waco, Texas, when Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms agents tried to serve warrants on the Branch Davidians; four agents and six Davidians were killed as a 51-day standoff began.
 February 29 In 1968, President Johnson's National Advisory Commission on Civil Disorders (also known as the Kerner Commission) warned that racism was causing America to move "toward two societies, one black, one white—separate and unequal."

ders with the intent to engage in criminal sexual activity.

"There is a possibility of charges in Portland," said Lt. Mike Hefley, a Portland police spokesman.

The girl's foster parents reported her missing Feb. 17, police said, after

she told them she was going to a movie, but failed to return home.

Little is known about the girl, other than that she is a ward of the state. According to Hefley, she has a "very severe background - she's had a pretty hard life."

Patricia Feeny, a spokeswoman for the Oregon Department of Human Services, said workers with the State Office for Services to Children and Families reassessed the girl's foster home and deemed it a safe place for her to return. Feeny said state and federal privacy law prevented her from releasing further information.

Oregon, faces an additional charge of sexual interference with a person under 14, which Vancouver police said is the equivalent of a sex-abuse charge.

McCrorry's father, John McCrorry, said his son and Walker had attended Jesuit High School in Portland, and that Walker came from a wealthy family. He said Walker's family vacationed in Vancouver when his son was younger.

Police News Briefs

Police Shoot Man After Carjacking

PORTLAND (AP) - Police shot a man in the hip Thursday after a carjacking and a high-speed chase on Interstate 5.

David Ernest Gildersleeve, 34, of Tualatin, was in fair condition at OHSU.

The alleged carjacking happened Thursday afternoon

when a man with a gun approached Mary R. Finzel, 49, outside a bakery and demanded her keys. The man took her four-door BMW and led police on a high-speed chase on Interstate 5 that ended when the suspect lost control of the car and drove into a ditch.

"It looks like the suspect came out of the car armed," Hefley said. "The officer fired at least one round striking the suspect."

Hefley said Gildersleeve has an extensive criminal record, including charges of theft, robbery, assault and resisting arrest.

Man Sentenced for Forest Park Killings

A confessed serial killer was sentenced to life in prison with no parole in Multnomah County Court Friday for murdering three women in 1999. Todd Allan Reed pleaded guilty under a plea bargain to the murders of 28-year-old Lilla Moler, 26-year-old Stephanie Russell and 17-year-old Alexandria Ison.

Police say all three were all strangled to death in Portland's Forest Park. The 34-year-old Reed showed no emotion in court as a judge read the sentence, but the victims' relatives cried throughout the sentencing. But prosecutors said the case is not closed because there are three other cases

involving missing women that they believe are linked to Reed. Police arrested Reed in July 1999 after the police crime lab found that DNA found on or near the victims' bodies matched Reed's DNA profile. Police had stored Reed's DNA while he was serving time in 1992 on attempted rape charges.

Students Injured in Knife Fight

A 14-year-old boy was arrested after a stabbing at Marshall High School on Thursday. Investigators said at least three students were taken to local hospitals with injuries. A 15-year-old stu-

dent was listed in fair condition after undergoing surgery at OHSU Hospital for a stab wound to the stomach. He also had cuts on his wrist and head. The 14-year-old was one of the three injured

students. He was treated at the hospital for a cut finger before being released to police. The fight broke out in the cafeteria at about 1 p.m. Investigators said it may have stemmed from a scuffle earlier in the day.

Vancouver Transient Murdered

A 43-year-old man was arrested in the slaying of another man at a transient camp, police said.

Harlen Dennis Wilson was

booked for investigation of first-degree murder after the body of Michael Eugene Forman, 37, was found along Discovery Trail on Friday, the

Vancouver Police Department said.

Forman had suffered head injuries, but the cause of death remained under investigation.
