Portland May Get Traffic Ticket Cameras

(AP) - Cameras that catch red-light runners in Portland could be on the way, under a bill the state Senate sent to the governor last week.

The measure, which won Senate approval with a 21-9 vote, would allow any city with a population of more than 30,000 to install cameras at problem intersections to take pic-

tures of drivers who speed through red lights.

Supporters said with five deaths every year resulting from collisions where someone ran a red light, the

bill could save lives.

"The measure seems to be working in those cities where it's been installed," said Sen. Verne Duncan, R-Milwaukie.

But opponents worried more cameras is the first step in creating a "Big Brother"-like state.

"I think it's rather insidious," said Sen. Bill Fisher, R-Roseburg. "I don't think a person should have to defend themselves if a police officer isn't there to see it."

Sen. Gary George, R-Newberg, said the solution is to put more police officers on street corners instead of cameras, especially since the camera systems will cost up to \$75,000. "Think about what it would cost to put an officer on the corner," he said.

The measure, HB2380, will only allow cameras to be operational at four intersections at any given time. Portland would be allowed to have cameras working at eight intersections. The cameras are triggered by sensors in the road that detect when a car passes through an intersection only after the light has turned red.

Armed Robbery Suspect Sought

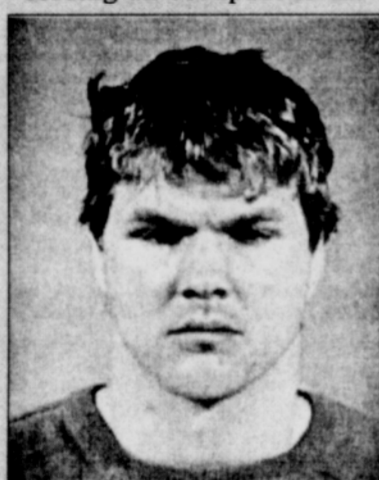
The Beaverton Police Department, in cooperation with Crime Stoppers, has issued a new plea to apprehend a man for armed robbery.

cause he had his 2-1/2 year-old daughter with him as he negotiated for a car date. Another arrest was made for ex-con in possession of a firearm. Several vehicles were towed.

Man Wanted for Bank Fraud

Police say the body of a young woman was found in her University of Portland dorm room Tuesday.

They are calling the death

"suspicious" but aren't releasing any details.

Friends found the body at Mehling Hall at about noon.

The private Catholic school

and police are in the process of notifying family members. The student's name hasn't been released. An autopsy is scheduled for Wednesday.

New Speed Limit Gains Support

(AP) - Speedy drivers would have the law on their side under a proposal approved by a Senate panel.

Sen. Randy Miller, sponsor of the bill to raise Oregon's speed limit to 75 mph, says the current 65 mph limit doesn't face the reality that most people drive at least 70 mph.

"It's insulting to most law enforcement and to our drivers," the Lake Oswego Republican said. "We have put them in a position of enforcing a law that no one respects."

Miller's proposal, SB502, would give the Oregon Department of Transportation the authority to set speed limits of up to 75 mph.

Oregon and Iowa are the only states west of the Mississippi River to have a general speed limit under 70 mph.

"There are parts of this state where it makes absolutely no sense to set the speed limit at 65," Miller said.

Gov. John Kitzhaber vetoed a similar 1999 measure to increase speed limits, but has

said he's willing to reconsider the issue this session.

Bob Russell, a lobbyist for the Oregon Trucking Association, said he supports rais-

ing the speed limit, but would rather see it at 70 mph for cars and 65 mph for trucks to maintain a 5 mph speed differential for safety reasons.
