



Following God's Health Plan

"Beloved, I wish above all things, that thou mayest prosper and be in health..." - 3 John 2

Formany, pain from a chronic disease is a wake-up call to make healthful life changes. If we respond appropriately, a healing response can occur. That was exactly what Thomas Jackson of Tennessee had to do. Since 17 years old, Jackson was afflicted with painful arthritis that kept him from starting a career in professional basketball. He found his answers in the Bible. After putting healthful, Biblical principles into practice, his arthritic condition improved greatly.

As a service to others, Jackson and his wife LaVerne lecture nationally as health educators - teaching others to heal their body, mind and spirit. Through their church in Tennessee, they run a health retreat program on 75-acres of land that's used to grow organic foods.

Just recently, the Jacksons were in northeast Portland at the Stone Tower Church, located at 3010 N.E. Holladay to present a week-long, free seminar on natural healing. Their focus was on imparting practical knowledge of natural health, scientific evidence and personal experiences.

Based on national studies, there are 10 leading diseases many Americans die from each year. Of this number, 8 are from a poor diet and smoking. Even our lifespan has been reduced remarkably since the days of Adam and Moses, where they lived to be over 900 years old. Nowadays, living 70 years is the norm.

Knowing this, the Jacksons formulated a program called G.O.D.'S. P.L.A.N., an effective eight point strategy for health and happiness consisting of (G)Godly Trust, (O)Open Air, (D)Daily Exercise, (S) Sunshine, (P)Proper Rest, (L)Lots of Water, (A)Always Temperate and (N)Nutrition.

At the recent seminar, the Jacksons lectured on various topics, from building a strong immune system to natural remedies - with God's Plan as their core philosophy. There was a handson cooking demonstration and an opportunity for a private health consultation.

The Jacksons will be in Portland again, later this year. Their plan is to establish another health retreat and obtain land to grow organic foods in this state.
