**PSU Hosts Vanport Classic Football**

Portland State University and Grambling State University have announced an agreement to meet in the inaugural Vanport Classic Football Game on Sept. 22 at newly-renovated PGE Park. The game will honor the legacy of the city of Vanport and the early days of Vanport College (now PSU) as well as the historically black colleges of the Southeast.

Both schools bring strong programs to the 2001 Vanport Classic that Portland State hopes to become an annual event. Grambling State finished the 2000 season with a 10-2 record and ranked 12th in the nation, while Portland State was ranked 15th at the season's conclusion with an 8-4 record, following a first-ever NCAA I-AA playoff appearance.

The game will be just a part of a week-long, city-wide event honoring the historical significance of Vanport in the African-American community of the Northwest.

During the 1940's, Vanport, located just north of Portland in the Columbia slough area, was the state of Oregon's second-largest city and the largest public housing project of the

time in the United States. More than 25,000 of the city's residents were African-Americans.

Vanport College was founded in 1946 and some of its first students were Vanport residents. A major flood wiped out much of the city and college of Vanport in 1948.

Some of the events planned to accompany the Vanport Classic Football Game:

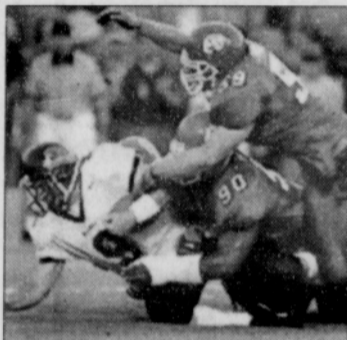
- \* The nationally-recognized Grambling State Marching Band will perform in a Friday concert at Pioneer Courthouse Square as well as during the Vanport Classic game.

- \* A pregame Tailgate Party at PGE Park.
- \* Several other events featuring the development of Vanport - the city and university - and the African-American Community in Portland.

**Bulldogs Stun No. 12 Beavers**

FRESNO, Calif. (AP)—In the biggest game of his career, David Carr had one of the most relaxing evenings he's ever spent on a football field. Carr threw for 340 yards and four touchdowns as Fresno State repeatedly struck with its big-play offense to upset No. 12 Oregon State — the highest-ranked team ever to visit Bulldog Stadium — 44-24. Carr was 21-for-34 as he tormented Oregon State's secondary in what he said was Fresno State's biggest home game ever. The senior quarterback was playing in front of dozens of family members against one of the nation's top defenses, and yet he never was worried.

Hill was aware of the watershed effects of such a convincing victory in front of a national television audience.

Carr and his fleet-footed corps of receivers delighted a frenzied sellout crowd and overwhelmed Oregon State's defense, which was the Pac-10's best last season.

Fresno State, which opened the season last week with a win at Colorado, posted its 16th straight home victory and made a strong case for its first national ranking since 1993. Bulldogs coach Pat

Extra bleacher seats and a giant video replay screen were installed at Bulldog Stadium for what Carr said was Fresno State's biggest home game ever. Fireworks flew across the sky with each Fresno State score, and a party atmosphere developed when the Bulldogs' victory seemed assured.
