Jordan Returning to NBA

WASHINGTON — Michael Jordan made his comeback official, announcing he will return to the NBA and sign a two-year contract with the Washington Wizards. "I am returning as a player to the game I love," Jordan said in a news release issued through his management agency.

He will earn between \$1.3 million and \$1.85 million, making him the biggest bargain in the league. As a part-owner (5 percent - 10 percent) and the president of basketball operations for Washington, under league rules, he must divest his ownership shares. That process has been set in motion and now is just a formality.

Bonds Four HRs from Setting Record

LOS ANGELES—Barry Bonds hit his 67th home run, leaving him four shy of breaking the record Mark McGwire set three years ago. The San Francisco slugger has 11 games remaining to reach 71.

Emmitt Smith Reaches Milestone

IRVING, Texas—Emmitt Smith is starting to realize just how close he is to becoming the NFL's career rushing leader. Smith took over the No. 2 spot from Barry Sanders, a Heisman Trophy winner out of Oklahoma State, after rushing for 85 yards in Dallas' 32-21 loss to San Diego.

Ryder Cup to Fall on Even-Numbered Years

VIRGINIA WATER, England — The Ryder Cup was rescheduled for Sept. 27-29, 2002, after terrorist attacks in the United States forced a year's postponement of the event. In addition, officials announced that the Ryder Cup now would be played in even-numbered years and the President Cup moved to odd-numbered years, beginning in 2003.

NFL to Have 16 Games; Playoffs Undecided

NEW YORK — After calling off the NFL games because of the suicide attacks on the USA, the NFL says it will stage a full 16-game schedule. However, the league has yet to announce if it will have the normal 12-team playoff or an eight-team postseason. The makeup games will be on Sunday, Jan. 6.

Trinidad-Hopkins to Face Off Sept. 29

NEW YORK — The undisputed middleweight championship fight between Felix Trinidad and Bernard Hopkins, which was postponed because of terrorist attacks, has been rescheduled for Sept. 29. The fight at Madison Square Garden, which had been set for Sept. 15, will be carried on HBO's pay-per-view arm, TVKO. The unbeaten Trinidad, of Puerto Rico, a former welterweight and super welterweight champion, is the WBA middleweight champion; Hopkins, of Philadelphia, is the IBF-WBC champion.

LARAMIE, Wyo. — Clinton Haskins, the lone survivor of a head-on collision that killed 8 University of Wyoming students, has been charged with 8 counts of aggravated homicide by vehicle.

Trailblazers Sign Chris Dudley

(AP) — The Portland Trail Blazers signed free agent center Chris Dudley to a one-year contract Friday.

Dudley, a 14-year veteran who spent four seasons with the Blazers, from 1993-97, played for Phoenix last season. He averaged 1.4 points and 3.5 rebounds in 53 games. He started 33 games.

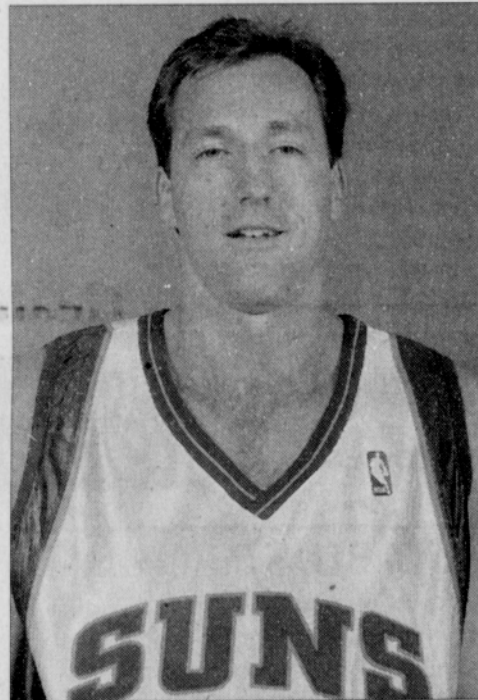
The 6-foot-11 player was traded to New Jersey in July as part of a trade that sent Jason Kidd from the Suns to the Nets for Stephon Marbury. But the Nets didn't re-sign Dudley.

Terms for Dudley's one-year deal were not announced.

The Blazers' starting center, Arvydas Sabonis, remains unsigned. The 7-foot-3 Lithuanian has not said whether he will retire or come back for one more season with the team. Sabonis, who turns 37 in December, made more than \$11 million last year, and the Blazers are trying to bring him back, but reportedly at a smaller salary.

Dudley, 36, has averaged 4.1 points and 6.3 rebounds with five NBA teams.
