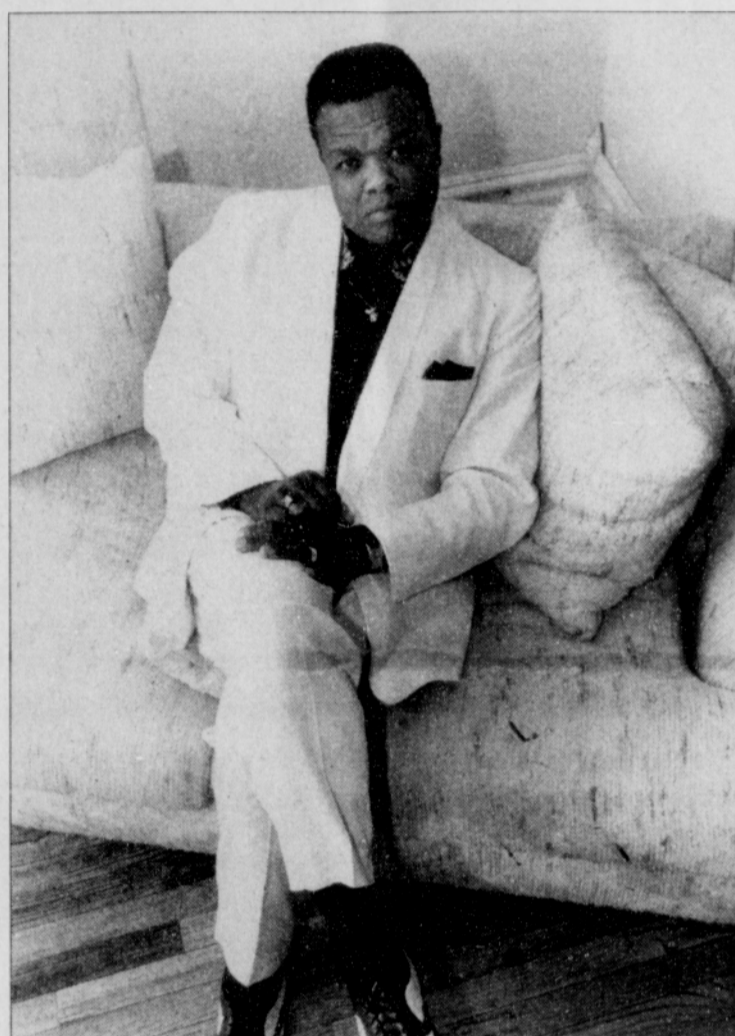
**Howloween at the Zoo** Oct. 27 - 28

**World's Greatest Masterpieces at Portland Art Museum**

Visitors to the Portland Art Museum, located this fall will come face to face with masterworks by some of the world's greatest artists, including Rembrandt, El Greco, Monet and Picasso, as the Portland Art Museum presents "European Masterpieces: Six Centuries of Paintings from the National Gallery of Victoria, Australia," on view through January 6, 2002.

The works in the exhibition represent a selection of the most significant Old Master and Modern European paintings from the National Gallery of Victoria, Australia, the oldest and grandest public art gallery in Australia. This collection of 88 paintings has never been seen outside of Australia and includes masterpieces by artists such as El Greco, Gainsborough, Rembrandt, Pissarro, Monet, Picasso and Hockney. The Portland Art Museum is the only West Coast venue for this important collection.

The exhibition is a walk through the history of European art, spanning six centuries, from Paolo Veneziano's "The Crucifixion" from circa 1349 to David Hockney's "The Second Marriage," 1963. Included are works by major artists from the 14<sup>th</sup> to the 20<sup>th</sup> century, including Tintoretto, Claude, Rembrandt, Canaletto, Bonnard, Magritte, Picasso, Balthus and Bacon.
