School Chief Charges Go to Court

(AP)—The state's ethics commission last week formally accused state School Superintendent Stan Bunn of more than 1,400 violations of ethics laws for allegedly misusing a state car, cell phone and frequent-flier tickets.

The Oregon Government Standard and Practices Commission made an initial finding that Bunn repeatedly violated a state law

prohibiting the use of public office for private financial gain.

The case now goes to Marion County Circuit Court, which will weigh the charges against Bunn. Bunn says he kept sloppy records but did not break the law. He hasn't said yet whether he will seek re-election this year as the state's top education official.

Bunn could be fined up to \$1,000 for each violation.
