Notice is hereby given that the City of Vancouver, Washington, will receive sealed bids up to the hour of 11:00 a.m., Pacific Standard time, Tuesday April 23, 2002, and publicly opened and read aloud at that time on the same day in Procurement Services Conference Room, 1400 Main Street, Vancouver, Washington, for the following:

The 2002 Pearson Airport Improvement Project will involve, but not be limited to, the following improvements:

1. Rehabilitate portions of the west apron and relocated parking facilities.
2. Rehabilitate and re-grade the East Side of north parallel taxiway.
3. Rehabilitate existing pavement along portions of the T-hangar taxilanes.
4. Relocation of the public parking area to avoid conflict with active aircraft movement areas and rehab access road and revise public parking area.
5. Remove landscape islands and pave/rehabilitate a new taxiway to replace current vehicular parking within active operations areas.
6. Install fencing and gates to control vehicular traffic.
7. Slurry seal and crack seal portions of two taxiways, several T-hangar taxilanes and part of the west apron.
8. Construct an aircraft wash-down area, including related drainage systems.
9. Install a new medium intensity taxiway lighting (MIRL) system.
10. Install mandatory lighted airport guidance signs.
11. Remove obstructions in the Runway 26 approach and update displaced threshold location, including installation of a new REIL, threshold lights, and displaced threshold markings.

This project is being funded in part by the Federal Aviation Administration, therefore both federal and state wage rates will apply. It is the responsibility of the Contractor to compare the federal and state prevailing wage rates, provided in the specification, and pay the highest wage rate applicable.

An optional pre-bid meeting will be held at the Aero Maintenance Conference Room, located at 101 East Reserve Street, on Monday, April 8, 2002 at 9:00 am.

The proposed contract is subject to following regulations:

1. The proposed contract is under and subject to Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1986 and to the Equal Employment Opportunity (EEO) and Federal Labor Provisions.
2. All labor on the project shall be paid no less than the minimum wage rates established by the U.S. Secretary of Labor.
3. Each Bidder must supply all information required by the bid documents and specifications.
4. The EEO requirements, labor provisions, and wage rates are included in the specifications and bid documents.
5. Each Bidder must complete, sign and furnish with his bid a "Certification of Nonsegregated Facilities" and a statement entitled "Bidders Statement of Previous Contract Subject to EEO Clause," as contained in the bid proposal.
6. A Contractor having 50 or more employees and his subcontractors having 50 or more employees and who may be awarded a contract of \$50,000 or more will be required to maintain and affirmative action program, the standards for which are contained in the FAA special provisions.
7. To be eligible for award each Bidder must comply with the affirmative action requirements which are contained in the specifications.
8. Minority Business enterprises will be afforded full opportunity to submit bids in response to this invitation and will not be discriminated against on the grounds of race, color, or national origin in consideration for an award of any contract entered into pursuant to this advertisement.
9. To be eligible for award each Bidder must comply with the

Buy American requirements which are contained in the specifications.

10. Women will be afforded equal opportunity in all areas of employment. However, the employment of women shall not diminish the standards or requirements for the employment of minorities.

Bidding documents may be obtained from the Owner's Office upon payment of \$50.00 plus sales tax, (if applicable) for each set of documents. Bids shall be placed in an envelope which is sealed and which clearly states the name of the bidder, the date of the bid opening, and appropriate wording to indicate definitely the nature of the contents. **Do not send bids by FAX.** Bids submitted via FAX will not be accepted.

The following is applicable to federal aid projects. The City of Vancouver, in accordance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, 78 Stat. 252, 42 U.S.C. 2000d to 2000-4 and Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, Department of Transportation, subtitle A, Office of the Secretary, Part 21, nondiscrimination in federally assisted programs of the Department of Transportation issued pursuant to such Act, hereby notifies all bidders that it will affirmatively insure that in any contract entered into pursuant to this advertisement, disadvantaged business enterprises will be afforded full opportunity to submit bids in response to this invitation and will not be discriminated against on the grounds of race, color or national origin in consideration for an award.
