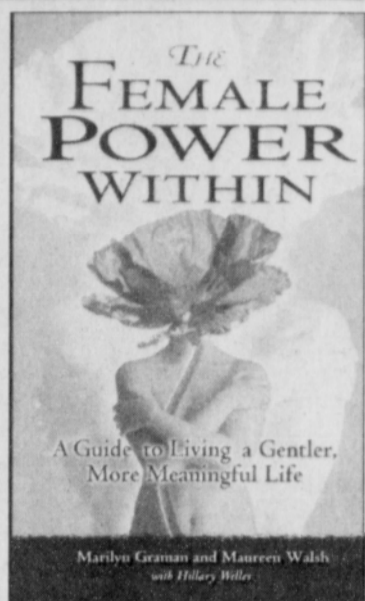

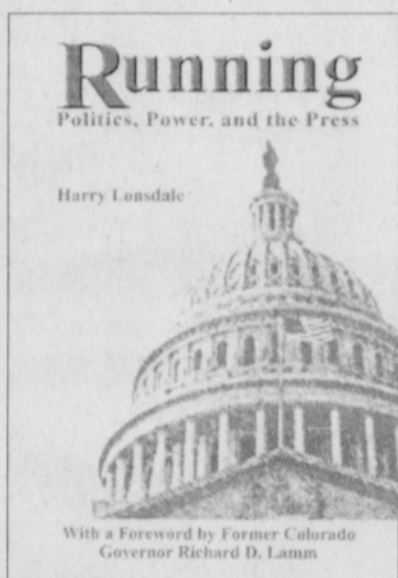


The Reality of Campaigning

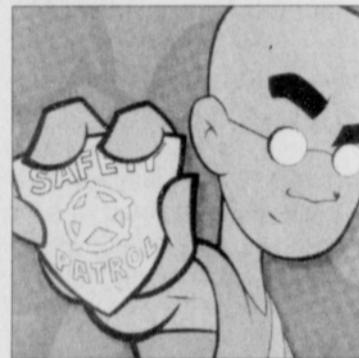
