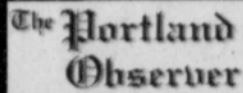

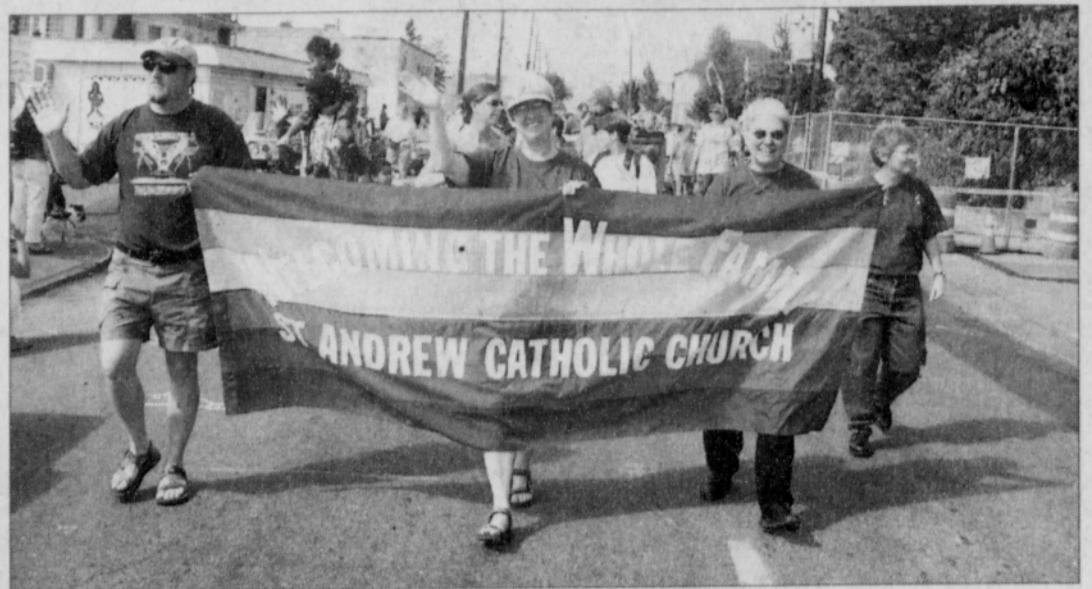

Adams Leads Ministries School

Portland International Community School, a program of Ecumenical Ministries of Oregon working in partnership with Portland Public Schools, has hired Harold "Skip" Adams to act as the director for the current school year.

The mission of PICS is to provide a quality education to immigrant, refugee and first generation youth, age 14 to 21, who have not been successful in the public school system. Student native languages include Spanish, Russian,

Ukrainian, Lithuanian, Vietnamese, Lao, Tagalog, Conjoval and Chuuk.

PICS is the only high school in Oregon dedicated to the education of refugee and immigrant students.

Adams has been working in education since 1968. He retired in 1998 after teaching for 25 years at MacLaren School. Adams taught all subjects to a small group of incarcerated juveniles in a halfway house and at the state's largest institution for ad-

judicated youth.

PICS students have special educational needs, due to cultural and language barriers. Immigrant, refugee and first-generation students often experience difficulty in the traditional public school system. Students come from a wide range of domestic environments, and many of their parents do not speak English.
