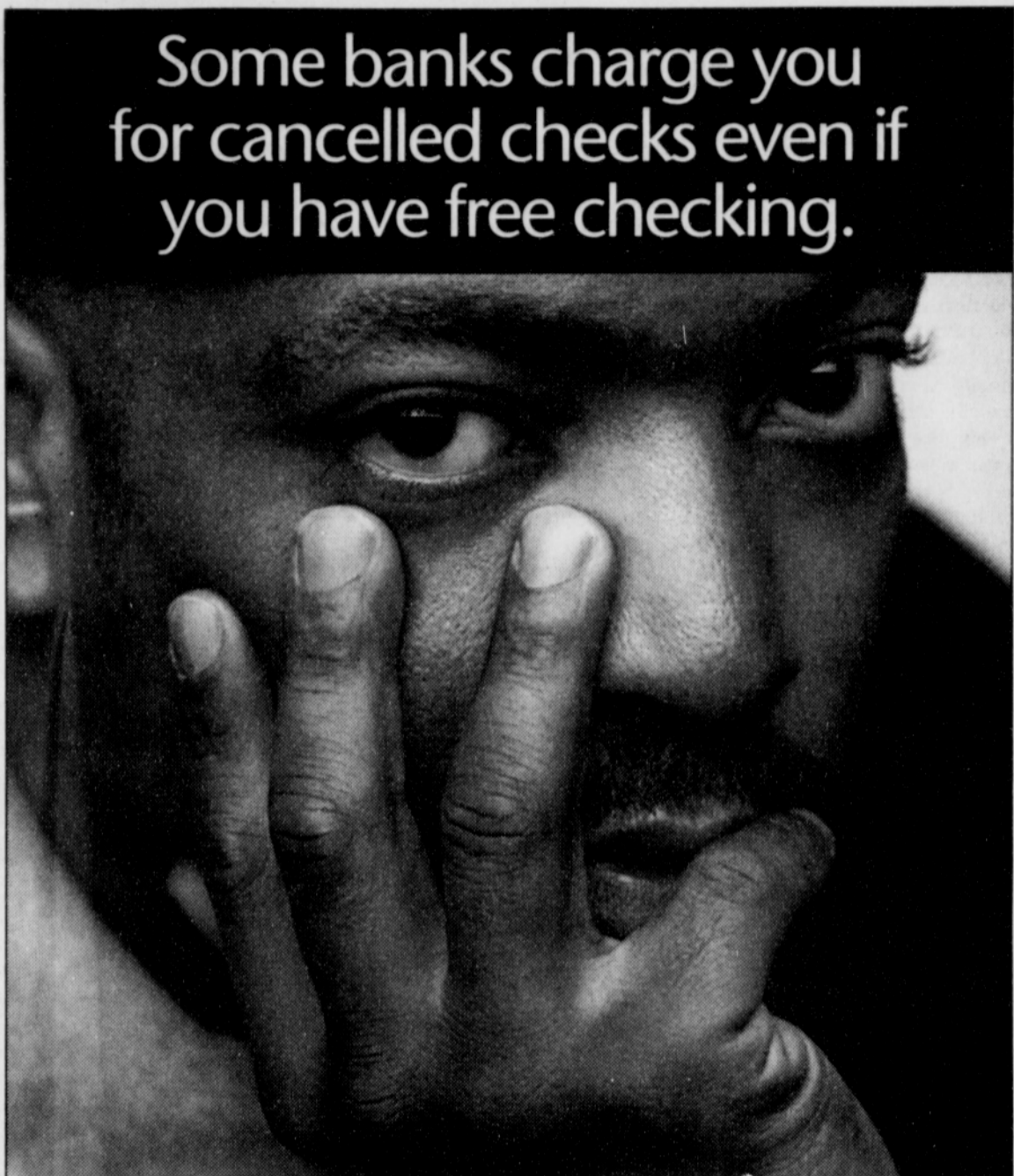
White Bird Dance; Wednesday, Oct. 16
