



If the street was named after (former Governor) Tom McCall, nobody would say anything about it," said Robert Phillips, the NAACP Portland chapter president at the time.

"What's going on is this: A lot of folks out there are genuinely upset about the way the City Council crammed the earlier name change from Union Avenue to Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard, down their throats," wrote then-Oregonian columnist Phil Stanford.

Huss and Baxter lost again when Leonard and Skanner publisher Bernie Foster, leaders in the campaign to change the street name to Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard, challenged the action in court and got it removed from the ballot.

In other words, despite all the commotion, the measure never got voted on.
