

The Buccaneers were once the laughingstock of football - entering the league in 1976 and losing their first 26 games. They were miserable through most of the 1980s and early 1990s, but started making strides in the last five years.

Portland Trail Blazers forward Rasheed Wallace was suspended Saturday for seven games without pay for confronting and threatening a referee outside the Rose Garden in Portland.

Referees mentioned the confrontation in a routine report filed after Portland's 100-92 victory over Memphis on Wednesday night.

NBA Vice President Stu Jackson said while there was no physical contact between Wallace and referee Tim Donaghy, the penalty was appropriate for Rasheed's actions, which was apparently a heated verbal exchange.

Wallace scored a season-high 38 points and had 10 rebounds Blazers in scoring the past three against Memphis.
