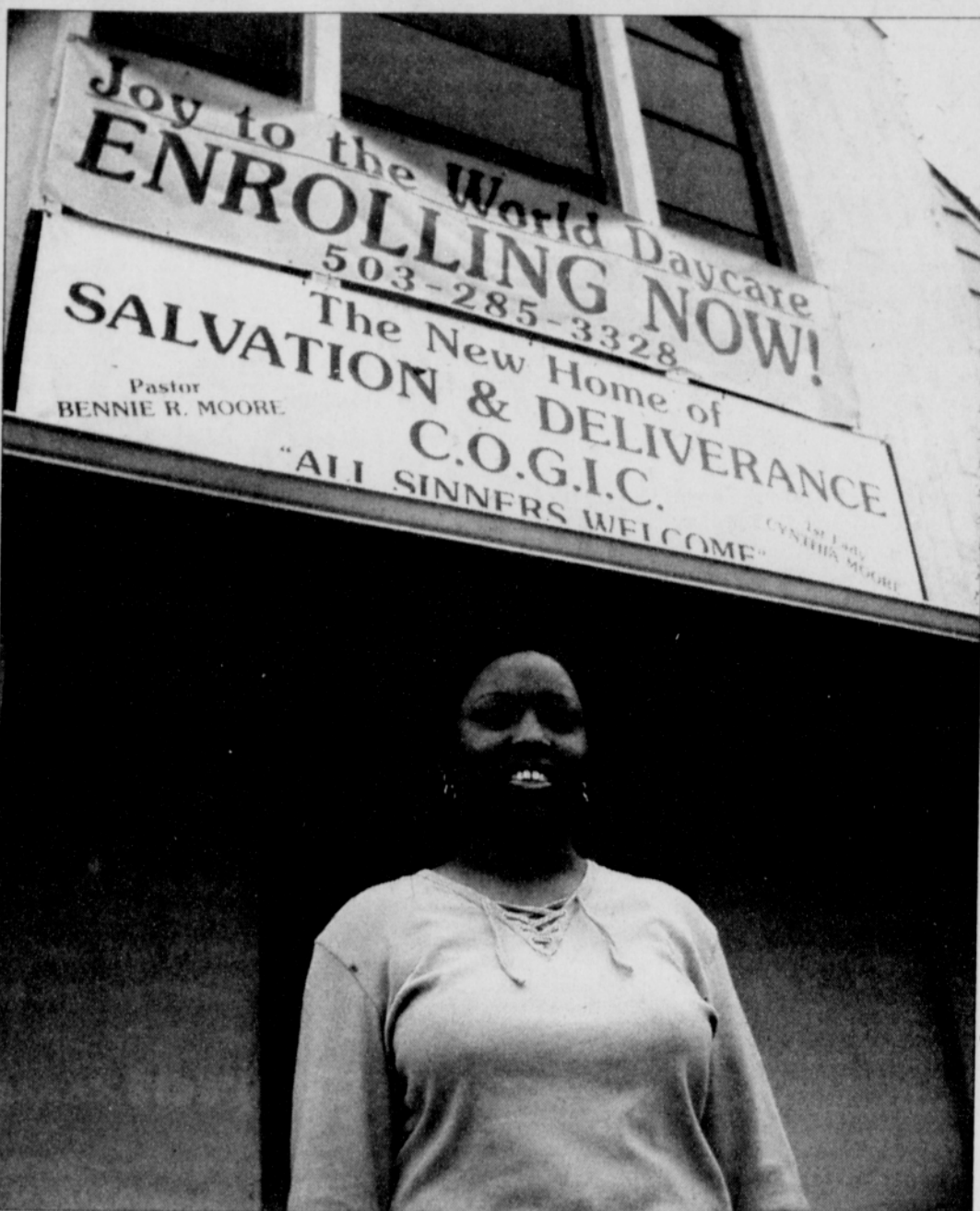
The center will operate with positive methods of disciplining children and plans to establish consistent, age-appropriate limits to help children function in their world.

Tuition-Free School Sets Open House

St. Andrew Nativity School, northeast Portland's tuition-free Catholic middle school, will hold an open house for the families of potential students on Saturday, March 8, from noon to 3 p.m.

St. Andrew provides tuition-free private middle school education to students who qualify for the Federal Free and Reduced Price Lunch Program and who are willing to work very hard in a highly structured school environment.

The school's mission is to prepare middle school students from low-income families for success in college prep high schools and beyond. The school day runs from 8 a.m. to 5:15 p.m. Monday

through Thursday and until 3:30 p.m. on Fridays. The school year is about 175 days. Weekend activities and participation in a summer program are also required.

Applicants should currently be in the fifth grade and from a family able to demonstrate economic need. Both boys and girls may apply. Students of all faiths and from all neighborhoods are welcome. Students currently enrolled in Catholic schools cannot be considered for application.
