## Yankees Beat Blue Jays, Lose Jeter

(AP)—A violent collision that left All-Star shortstop Derek Jeter with a dislocated left shoulder overshadowed all the good that happened for the New York Yankees on opening day.

Hideki Matsui got his first hit, Roger Clemens won his 294th game and Alfonso Soriano hit his first career grand slam as the Yankees beat the Toronto Blue Jays 8-4 Monday night.

Jeter, the heart and soul of the Yankees, was injured in the third inning when Toronto catcher Ken Huckaby landed on his shoulder during a frightening play at third base.

Jeter was down for more than 10 minutes, writhing in pain and surrounded by worried teammates. He was helped onto a cart by trainers Gene Monahan and

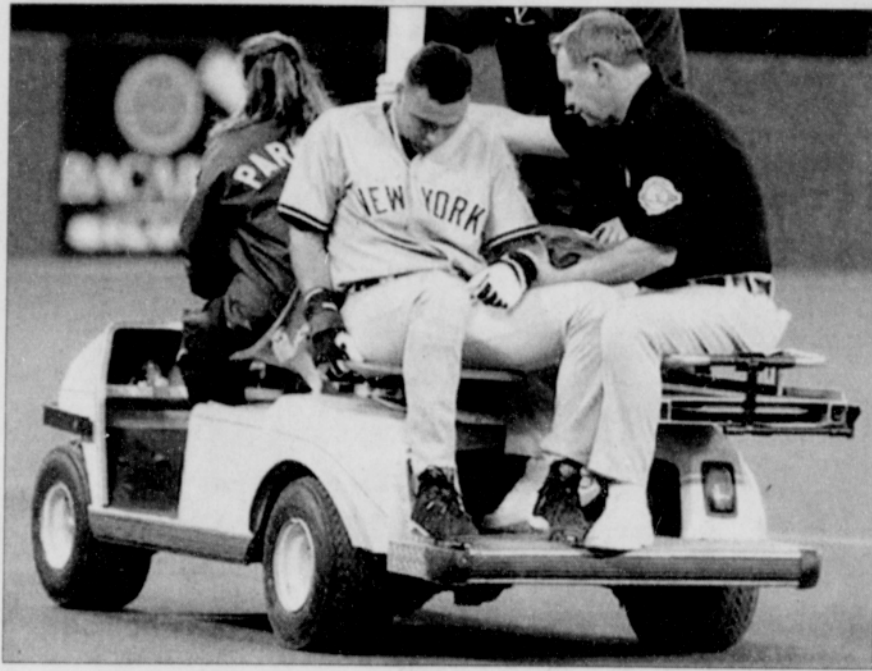
Steve Donohue, strapped in place sitting upright and taken off the field - his head bent, his face dripping with sweat.

The shoulder was popped back in place, and Jeter was taken to a hospital for X-rays. There was no immediate word on how long New York would be without the five-time All-Star, the Yankees' leader during their run of four World Series titles and five AL pennants since 1996.

That was the only thing that went wrong as the Yankees began their 100th anniversary season with their first opener outside the United States.

Jeter was hurt when he tried to go from first to third on Jason Giambi's comebacker with Toronto's defense shifted to the right side of the infield.

Huckaby ran up the line to field

first baseman Carlos Delgado's throw. Jeter dived headfirst into the bag, and Huckaby fell, his

shin guard driving into Jeter's shoulder.

Much of the focus was on

Matsui, whose every step has been chronicled by a horde of Japanese journalists.

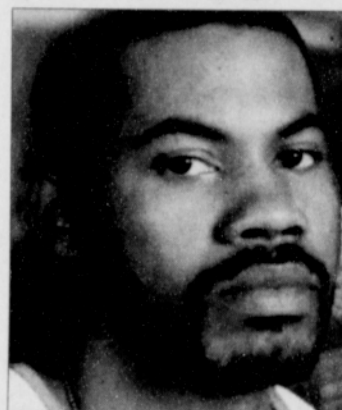

## Drug Charges Dropped for Wallace

Blazer will pay a fine, attend drug counseling

(AP) — Rasheed Wallace agreed Monday to attend drug counseling, pay a \$650 fine and stay out of legal trouble for the next six months to have marijuana charges against him dropped.

Wallace and teammate Damon Stoudamire were passengers in a vehicle that was stopped for speeding on Nov. 22 on a high-

way outside Chehalis, following a game against Seattle. A search of the vehicle turned up a small amount of marijuana, police said.

Stoudamire, Wallace and driver Ed Smith of Portland were cited and released. All three pleaded innocent to the charges, punishable by a fine of up to \$1,000 and three months in jail.

Stoudamire previously agreed to attend drug and alcohol counseling and stay out of legal trouble for the next year to have misdemeanor charges against him dropped. Smith agreed to the same terms.
