

Today his service boasts eight children around the clock. The days at 'Your Child's Day Care' are filled with story-time, coloring, games of musical chairs and playing on the swing set of jungle gym. Morris puts his cooking skills to work by serving up two or three full course USDA Food Program certified meals.

"These kids get a wholesome meal," Morris said. "That's something a lot of kids don't get at home."

Many of the kids he watches are also lacking a strong male role model. Morris said that he knows some mothers may be wary of sending their children to a male day care provider when the industry is made up predominately of women, but most of the women who bring their children to him consider the fact that he's a man as a plus.

"If Dad's not around, they can call me," Morris said. "I have a lot of women who call me outside of day care hours if their children are having a problem. If the kids aren't acting right, I'll talk to them."

Morris said his real payment comes from knowing he is helping others.

"I am very needy-friendly," he said. "Sure, I'd like to get \$50 an hour but this isn't our main source

wild and full of comic error as it would be at 'Daddy Day Care,' but Morris said the kids have a blast. He never limits their noise levels and lets the kids take summers off from school year bookwork. Morris said he thinks kids need to be kids and everybody needs a vacation.

Even though Morris said he knows the movie 'Daddy Day Care' will probably lead to increased public scrutiny about male-operated child care services, he thinks the premise is a great one and plans to take his children to see it this week.

"If I don't take them to see it they'll get a new daddy," Morris said. "There won't be any more of this daddy day care, that's for sure."


