Impoverished supporters of president clash with opponents

(AP)—Venezuela troops fought pitched street battles Friday with supporters of President Hugo Chavez who tried to disrupt an opposition rally in an impoverished area of Caracas considered a government stronghold. At least three people were injured.

Troops in armored vehicles arrived at the scene while "Chavistas," as the president's supporters are bottles, rocks and firecrackers at security forces.






