In an unjust, callous last minute act, help to families with incomes between \$10,500 and \$26,600 was eliminated. Yet every millionaire will get a \$93,500 tax break this year.

After a huge public outcry, this flagrantly unjust action was swiftly corrected by the Senate by a vote of 94-2 without adding to the deficit. The House should do the same immediately.

Yet House leaders are putting up roadblocks and trying to give still more tax breaks to higher income families by insisting on a \$82 billion bill to correct a \$3.5 billion injustice.

Poor children in working families should not be held hostage to more

political shenanigans. Quick action is essential to help excluded low-income families.


