Foxx Assault Trial Delayed

(AP)-Comedian Jamie Foxx's trial on charges from a fight with guards at Harrah's Casino in New Orleans has been delayed until Sept. 8.

Police said Foxx, his sister, Diedra Dixon, and others in the entertainer's 10person entourage refused a guard's order to show identification when they entered the casino on April 26.

Foxx splashed water from a fountain, cursed loudly, then refused to leave when security guards asked and fought with police, sending one officer to the hospital, police said.

He pleaded innocent to the misdemeanor charges.

Dixon faces an extortion charge for allegedly threatening to cut a Harrah's guard unless he allowed her inside the casino.

Eminem, who was staying at the Art House Hotel in Glasgow, went further than Jackson by tossing the doll into the air and catching it.

Scotland's Daily Record tabloid said the incident occurred as fans and photographers gathered outside the hotel before Eminem's concert in the city.

Eminem, whose nickname is Slim Shady, is on a British tour but has kept a low-profile between shows.

The Daily Record said he took over 50 rooms at the hotel for his entourage.
