Riverside Disqualification Called Unjust

The Riverside Little League of northeast Portland has filed an appeal to stop a district Little League tournament after a decision they call unjust. Riverside's All Stars in the boys 9-10 age group were declared ineligible Monday after defeating the Parkrose All Stars at the District 1 tournament in Scappoose.

Little League officials disqualified the team over a player's residency requirements.

Riverside officials believe without a doubt, that they should be able to continue playing in the tournament. They said the player was questioned about his eligibility to play six days prior to the playoffs, but tournament officials failed to follow through with the report.

After defeating Parkrose in the tournament, Parkrose officials brought up the question of his suitability to participate in the tournament, ultimately leading to the disqualification.
