### Pioneer feminist explored at North Portland Library

The multimedia exhibit highlights the compelling story of Mary Baker Eddy, a 19th century reformer

## Artist Gets Political

### Simmons faces subpoena after challenging mandatory drug tests

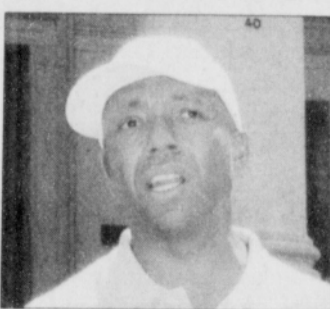
(AP) — Hip-hop mogul Russell Simmons faces an Aug. 20 deadline to comply with a state subpoena into whether he violated lobbying laws while trying to reform the state's mandatory drug sentencing statutes.

Simmons and former NAACP leader Benjamin Chavis had sought a temporary restraining order in federal court in Manhattan to put a hold on a state lobbying commission investigating the civic leaders.

State law requires lobbyists to register and document their spending to reveal the pressure and influence on state lawmakers and officials.

Simmons and Chavis said they

were exercising their constitutional right to petition government and were unaware of the State Lobbying Act requirements. The two men and the Coalition of Fairness had sought reform or repeal of the Rockefeller-era drug laws that mandate long sentences even for possessing and selling small amounts of illegal drugs.

Mars is the star of the show, in a special sky watch party sponsored by the Oregon Museum of Science and Industry.

OMSI will join the Rose City Astronomers and Vancouver Sidewalk Astronomers for a special Mars Viewing Party, Saturday, Aug. 23 from 8:30 p.m. to midnight.

Mars will not only be in direct alignment with the sun and Earth, an occurrence referred to as the Martian Opposition, but it will also be closer to Earth than humankind has ever seen.

"That's because of the planets' elliptical orbits," said Jim Todd, OMSI Murdock Planetarium manager. "They do not orbit in perfect circles, so it takes 60,000 years for Earth and Mars to meet up at their closest possible point," he said.
