Legendary Charles Remembered

Friends, family pay tribute to UP coach

(AP)—They called him a "living legend," a role model and a generous friend.

Friends and family eulogized University of Portland soccer coach Clive Charles on Monday with prayer, songs and praise for a prolific career that also raised the college's profile with winning men's and women's soccer teams.

Charles, who died Aug. 26 at age 51 from prostate cancer, led the Portland women's team to last year's national championship as he battled the cancer.

University officials, students and others called Charles a loving, determined and devoted man who cared as much about his players as he did about winning.

Charles taught his teams about life as well as soccer, players said.

He was a stickler for details, Portland soccer player Imani Dorsey said, demanding that players tuck in their jerseys and polish their shoes.

But the energetic Englishman also had a lively sense of humor, and would make outrageous bets, Dorsey said. "He was never ashamed to sucker someone into losing his money," she said.

Charles, who grew up in a poor

London neighborhood, began his soccer career as a teenager with West Ham United. He played as a defender for the Portland Timbers, Pittsburgh Spirit and Los Angeles Lasers.

In 1986, Charles became coach of Portland's men's team, and took over the women's team three years later.

Charles led the university to 13 conference titles, 20 NCAA tournament berths and seven Final Four appearances. He was one of five NCAA coaches to win more than 400 college soccer games. Charles also coached the U.S. men's team in the 2000 Olympics.

Nike President Phil Knight praised Charles as "a fabulous man, coach and teacher."

Knight said Nike will help fund a new University of Portland soccer complex honoring Charles. The school plans to build practice fields and a larger stadium for spectators around the existing Harry A. Merlo soccer field.

Strong Season Opener for PSU

Portland State football holds its second straight home game at 6 p.m. Saturday, when the Vikings battle 20th-ranked Nicholls State.

The Vikings are coming off an impressive 34-21 win over Texas A&M-Kingsville. New starting quarterback Joe Wiser was responsible for four touchdowns, throwing for three and running for one. Sophomore linebacker Joey King earned Big Sky Conference Defensive Player of the Week honors after making 17 tackles, three for loss, and one sack.

Kobe's Lawyers Want Accuser to Testify

(AP) — Kobe Bryant's attorneys want his accuser to testify at next month's hearing that will determine whether the NBA superstar will stand trial on a sexual assault charge.

Bryant, 25, is charged with assaulting the woman, who worked at the mountain resort lodge where he stayed June 30. The Los Angeles Lakers guard has said the two had consensual sex.

Defense attorneys Pamela Mackey and Hal Haddon issued a subpoena to the 19-year-old woman to have her appear at the Oct. 9 preliminary hearing, prosecution spokeswoman Krista Flannigan said Tuesday.

She said prosecutors were discussing whether to ask the judge to throw out that subpoena. Such a request would not be unusual, she said. "If it were to happen, it would be pretty quickly," Flannigan said.

internship or class credit for participating.

Neal says her "learn by doing" approach is the best way to accomplish the lofty goals of changing people's behavior.

"This is about integrating a pattern of behavior and changing the background of society and that requires more than just appealing to passive learning," she said.

Participants learn about kidneys by studying nutrition and

the importance of physical activity. They shadow students, take tours of health facilities, including Oregon Health and Science University's kidney and dialysis units, and observe kidney dissections.

The program is mostly composed of minority students, and all presentations have been in north and northeast Portland.

A group of graduates from the 12-week program from Youth Opportunities Center developed a skit to educate their peers and community about kidney health,

and Benson High School's health careers students developed a kidney model with a presentation to Hosford Middle School's physical education classes. These projects expanded into video productions and poster projects by McCoy Academy students and the Urban League.

The MIKE program meets curriculum standards for 11th grade health classes, and Neal would like to expand the program into classrooms.

"There's a genuine need for the youth to develop tools that will raise awareness and help prevent kidney disease. If the medical community had good teaching tools, we wouldn't have this problem," she said.
