A case of influenza has been confirmed in older, residents of nursing or other long-term Portland, bringing the flu season to Oregon care facilities. People who live, work or provide earlier than usual this year, according to the Oregon Department of Human Services.

"Our best advice is, get your flu shot," said Dr. Mel Kohn, state epidemiologist.
