(AP)—Singer Mary J. Blige will perform during halftime at the Detroit Lions' Thanksgiving Day game against the Green Bay Packers.

The game - and the sixth-annual halftime show - will be broadcast from Detroit on the Fox network. Celebrity newlyweds Jessica Simpson and Nick Lachey are slated to make cameo appearances from Los Angeles, organizers said.

## Aaliyah's Pilot Had Cocaine in System

**Airplane crash that killed singer investigated**

(AP)—An autopsy found drugs and alcohol in the body of the pilot of the plane that crashed in the Bahamas killing the singer Aaliyah and eight other people in 2001, a

doctor testified during a coroner's inquest.

Pilot Luis Antonio Morales had cocaine and traces of alcohol in his system, pathologist Dr. Giovander Raju testified at the inquest on Abaco Island, where the crash occurred.

The autopsy findings of cocaine and alcohol were disclosed in July by the Bahamas Department of Civil

Aviation.

Investigators have said they believe the twin-engine Cessna 402B was overloaded by 700 pounds when it crashed shortly after take-off from Marsh Harbor in the Bahamas en route to Florida on Aug. 25, 2001.

Aaliyah was in the Bahamas to shoot the video "Rock the Boat," which the 22-year-old singer had

just finished at the time of her death.

Aaliyah's parents filed court papers in September saying they had reached an undisclosed settlement in a negligence lawsuit against the plane's operator Blackhawk International Airways Corp., owners Skystream Inc. and Gilbert Chacon and flight broker Atlantic Flight Group.

## Supermodel Sued by Former Assistant

(AP)—Naomi Campbell has been sued by a former administrative assistant who alleges the supermodel struck her and threw a phone at her during a tantrum two years ago in a Beverly Hills hotel.

The lawsuit, filed Sept. 15 in state Superior Court in Morris County, was reported last week by the Star-Ledger of Newark.

Simone Craig, 29, of Morristown, alleges Campbell grabbed her by the arms and threw her down on a couch during a tantrum at L'Hermitage Hotel. It also alleges that Campbell held Craig prisoner in

the room and yelled at her, "You're going to stay here and do your job."

John Rosenberg, a lawyer for the 33-year-old British model, told The Associated Press Tuesday that Campbell "categorically denies the allegations."

In February 2000, Campbell pleaded guilty in Toronto to an assault charge for beating assistant Georgina Galanis while making a film in Canada in 1998. Under an agreement with the prosecution, Campbell expressed remorse and was released without punishment
