Advantage's main office is on Killingsworth Street at North Interstate Avenue. They also have a branch in Hermiston.

According to Willamette's President and CEO, Wendy Whittaker, the merger will make a number of additional services available to members of Willamette including on-line banking, and credit cards.

The combined credit union will have assets in excess of \$35 million, Advantage.

Black History Museum **Approved** Center would become part of the **Smithsonian**

(AP) - Congress has approved the creation of a national museum of black history and culture, where visitors from around the world can learn about 400 years of struggle and progress.

"America will finally have a museum worthy of the generation of men and women who have sacrificed so much and given so deeply to the cause of freedom," Senate Majority Leader Bill Frist of Tennessee said.

The measure now goes to President Bush.

Georgia Rep. John Lewis, a former civil rights leader, introduced legislation to create the museum in each Congress since 1988. Every time, for one reason or another, the measure failed in the House or

But if Bush signs the bill into law, it would clear the way for fund raising and for the Smithsonian Board of Regents to choose a site for it within a year.

"John Lewis, when he came to Washington this became a personal crusade," said Sen. Harry Reid, D-Nev. "This is the culmination of a dream he started years ago."

The estimated \$400 million initial price tag would be split evenly between the federal government and private sources. The bill authorizes \$17 million in the first year to start the project.

Proposed sites are the Smithsonian's Arts and Industries Building; an area near the Washington Monument; an area closer to the Jefferson Memorial; and a waterfront site a few blocks south of the Mall.
