Officer Smeared in Poster Campaign

Foxworth calls Copwatch tactics divisive

A campaign to obtain a photograph of the police officer who shot and killed Kendra James during a traffic stop last May has stunned the Portland law enforcement community.

A group calling itself Rose City Copwatch claims to have distributed 300 posters in areas of southeast Portland offering \$40 in groceries for a picture of officer Scott McCollister.

The fliers smear McCollister as an "armed and dangerous killer" and call for his removal from the police force. The distribution coincided with his return to duty in the Police Bureau's Southeast Precinct after a five month suspension.

Portland Police Chief Derrick Foxworth condemned the poster campaign as "sophomoric and divisive" saying it did nothing to promote healing or strengthening the partnership between the police and the community.

"It is time to build trust and increase communication between police and the community, not to drive wedges of mistrust and contempt," Foxworth said.
