Sealed bids will be received at the Housing Authority of Portland (HAP), 4400 NE Broadway, Suite B, Portland, Oregon 97213, until **2:00 pm, Tuesday April 6, 2004** for labor and material to convert seven apartments into five ADA accessible units, relocate the manager's office and create a new community room at the Medallion Apartments. Shortly thereafter, bids will be opened and publicly read. **The First Tier Subcontractor List, HAP-421, must be received by 4:00 p.m. the same day.** No bidder may withdraw their bid after the hour set for opening until after the lapse of sixty (60) days from the bid opening.

The basic work consists of: masonry, concrete and carpentry work, new windows, gypsum board, ceramic tile, kitchen and bath cabinetry, flooring, decorative epoxy flooring, painting, concrete work, plumbing, suspended ceiling installation, mechanical and electrical work.

Bid Documents are available at the HAP Office noted above, on Monday March 8, 2004; A \$50 deposit for one set and \$20 (twenty) for each additional set is refundable when documents are returned within 10 days after bid opening.

He said he would work to abolish the death penalty and replace it with mandatory life sentences with no parole, plus restitution to the victim's heirs.

Shields rounds out his philoso-

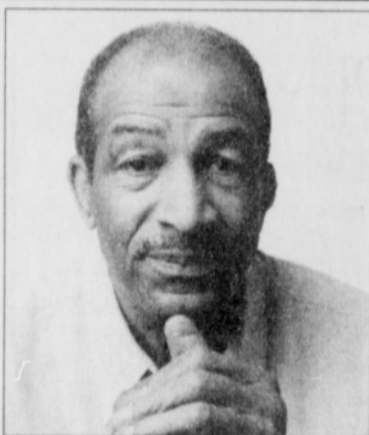
phy of government by being pro-choice on abortion rights and supporting marriage rights for gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender people.

"I believe in fairness in the execution of law," Shields said.

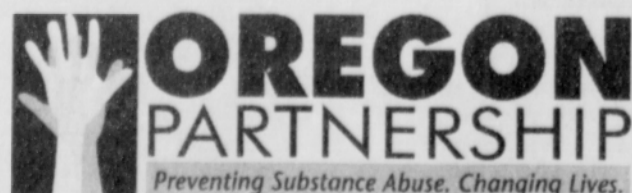

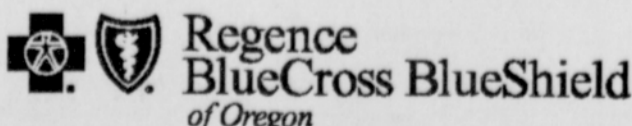
