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

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

Withdraws hosting of Motown celebration (AP)—Justin Timberlake

has backed out of an agreement to co-host ABC's "Motown 45" special because of a conflict with filming his first movie "Edison," Timberlake's spokesman Ken Sunshine announced last week.

"He'll be in the middle of filming when the event is scheduled to be taped, and that's the reason he can't do it, and that's the only reason he can't doit," Sunshine said.

The recent Grammy winner had been tapped earlier this year to co-host the anniversary celebration of the legendary soul music label along with Lionel Richie.


