Families Shorted on Tax Credits

(AP) - A federal program that can ties around the country into the financial boost a low-income family's tax credit by thousands of dollars, is not reaching some of the neediest households.

Only 36 percent of the eligible Hispanic families surveyed in California's San Joaquin Valley received the EITC they were entitled to last year - even though the credit can provide up to \$4,000 for households headed by the working poor.

The disparity was evident in the partial results of the Rural Families Speak Project - a five-year survey by universi-

well-being of rural families.

Volunteers helping taxpayers in isolated communities say their clients' inability to access agencies that could tell them about the credit, along with language differences and cultural assumptions, often keep Hispanics from receiving the credit.

EITC is often considered the most successful federal anti-poverty program. More eligible families get the EITC than traditional assistance programs like Medicaid or food stamps. In the last tax year, it gave \$36.9 billion back to qualifying families.




