## Boxer Suffers Setback

Lampkin reprioritizes after disqualification

Up and coming boxing featherweight from northeast Portland suffered a discouraging blow when he missed the USA Boxing Olympic team trials because he overslept.

Officials say that although Ray Lampkin III was only five minutes late to his weigh in, he was disqualified from the team.

Lampkin, who trains at the Matt Dishman Community Center, is still the first alternate for the Olympic Team. He will train with Olympians from June 3<sup>rd</sup> through 17<sup>th</sup> at North Michigan University.

Lampkin will also fight in the Titan World Games in Atlanta, Ga. from June 17<sup>th</sup> through 20<sup>th</sup>. He will compete against fighters from Germany and Mexico in those games.

He's toying with turning pro after the summer Olympics but says he may continue gaining experience in the amateur ring.

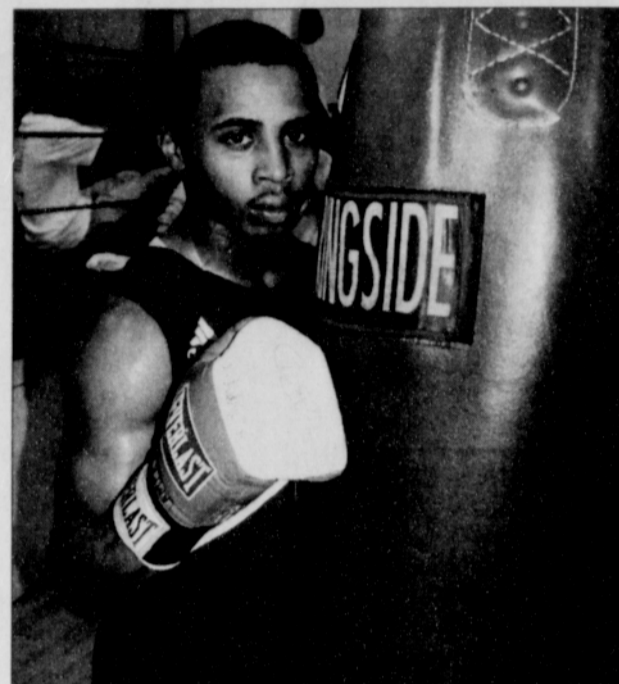

## Stanford Hires Head Coach

(AP) — Trent Johnson found a job that was too good to pass up after his old boss left Stanford for the NBA. The former Cardinal assistant - coming off a breakthrough season at Nevada - was hired to replace Mike Montgomery, a Pac-10 source told The Associated Press on Monday.

The 47-year-old Johnson met with school officials for about six hours on campus Sunday. He's expected to be formally introduced as the new Stanford coach within the next few days.

Montgomery, who was at

Stanford for 18 years and led the Cardinal to the Final Four in 1998, left last week to coach the Golden State Warriors.

Stanford has been to the second round of the NCAA tournament for 10 straight years. The Cardinal won their first 26 games this season and finished the regular season ranked No. 1 with a 29-1 mark.

Johnson agreed to a new five-year contract worth \$450,000 a season with Nevada in March after leading the Wolf Pack to the NCAA tournament's round of 16 for the first time.

## Concordia in NAIA World Series

Concordia University of northeast Portland will face #8 William Penn on Friday, with the winner set to face #1 Oklahoma City on Saturday in the NAIA World Series.

The Cavaliers baseball team is the #9 seed in national tournament played in Lewiston, Idaho on the campus of Lewis-Clark State College.

Two players who graduated from

local schools, Andre Goodlow at Cleveland and Ryan Sharp at Benson are on the Concordia team.

The Cavaliers won the Region I tournament last weekend by beating Point Loma Nazarene 2-out-of-3 at home.

It's the first trip ever to the World Series for the northeast Portland college.

## Seattle Mariners Struggle

(AP) — They've been one of baseball's top teams in recent years, winning a remarkable 116 games only three seasons back. So far in 2004, however, the Seattle Mariners are one of the worst clubs in the majors.

"I don't think anybody expected this," catcher Dan Wilson said.

At 15-28, Seattle came out of the weekend stuck at the bottom of the AL West, trailing first-place Ana-

heim by 13 1/2 games. The Mariners avoided a home-field sweep against Detroit with a 3-1 win Sunday, their third victory in 14 games.

Jamie Moyer and the starting pitchers had a rough start, going a combined 3-9 in April. While each has shown signs of recovering recently, Seattle's usually reliable bullpen - missing Kazuhiro Sasaki after his return to Japan in the offseason - has been inconsistent.
