Murder Suspect Wanted

Richard "Ricardo" Aguilar Hernandez, 22, is wanted for murder in the death of Arturo Martinez in the company of his 16-year-Navarro, 25, and wanted for attempted murder in the shooting of Juan Amaro Benitez, 27. Both men were shot at about 2 a.m. on May 3 at the Pineview Apartments, 8366 S.E. Causey Ave.

Hernandez is also wanted on a probation violation for carrying a dangerous weapon and a warrant for rape. He has family and friends in both He has a tattoo of three dots on both hands. He may north Clackamas County and in the Cully neighborhood of northeast Portland.

Police also said he may be old girlfriend and uses TriMet as a primary mode of transportation.

Hernandez is about 5 feet 8 inches tall, 165 pounds, with brown hair and brown eyes.

Ricardo Hernandez be armed with the handgun he used in the shooting, and he should be considered armed and dangerous.



Sandy Boulevard Robbery Investigated

The Portland Police Bureau. in cooperation with Crime Stoppers is asking for the public's help in identifying a robbery suspect.

On Thursday, April 1, a man entered the C&L market at 11626 N.E. Sandy Blvd. Police said he bought a beer and then pulled out a gun demanding money from the clerk. Detectives said the suspect is a Hispanic male in his late 20s, about 5 feet 8 inches tall and about 140 pounds. He has brown eyes and brown hair and a goatee.

He was wearing a white base-

Arrest Made in 1970 Cop Slaying

(AP) - A man described by the Los Angeles Times as a former low-level associate of the Black Panthers has been arrested in connection with a Berkeley police officer's 1970 slaying that police at the time called a political assassination.

Don Juan Warren Graphenreed, 55, is charged with suspicion of murder and conspiracy to commit murder in the killing of Officer Ronald Tsukamoto.

In a statement, Berkeley police said Graphenreed "did not act alone and is only one of several suspects."

The San Francisco Chronicle quoted unidentified sources as saying the shooting was intended to raise the suspect's stature in a black organization that advocated violence against police.

Tsukamoto, 28, had stopped a motorcyclist for a traffic violation. As the officer talked with the motorcyclist, another man approached, exchanged a few words, then fired two shots from a pistol - one hitting Tsukamoto in the eye.

At the time, the killing was the third targeting an officer in the San Francisco Bay area within a two-month span. Bruce Baker, then Berkeley's police chief, called it an "assassination."


