A northeast Portland student has earned special recognition in the annual Mt. Hood Regional High School Art Exhibit.

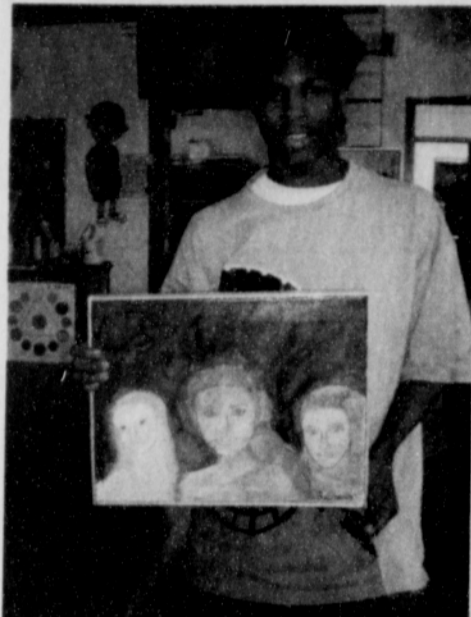
DeShanté Bolds was honored for best two-dimensional work by a junior.

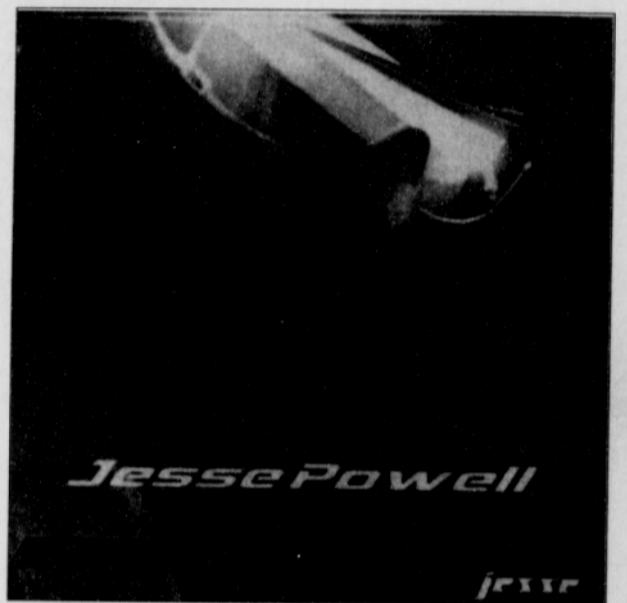

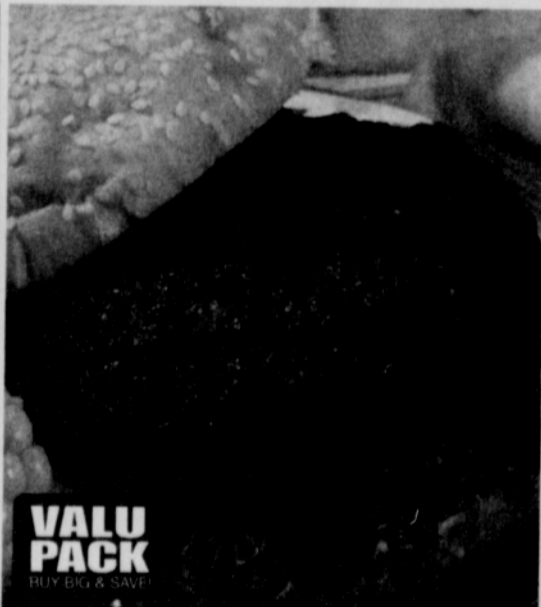

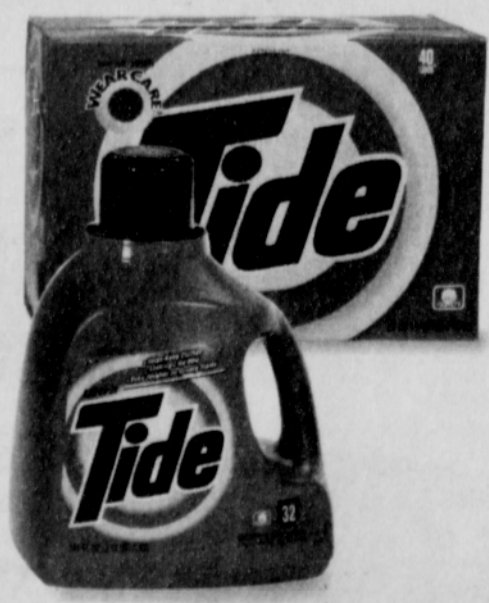
