

Fall elections inspire youth turnout

If anybody has an opinion it's young people, so why aren't they exercising their cherished freedom of expression at the ballot box? This is the big question stumping political parties from every angle.

The presidential elections of 2000 saw the lowest turnout among young voters since 1972 when 18 year olds first gained the right to

Accordingly, new efforts are now in the making to reverse the political participation in the young generation. Polls indicate that this fall young people are more interested in voicing their opinions and may vote with a vengeance.

In hopes of increasing the turnouts of young people, the Secretary of State Bill Bradbury and Su-Susan Castillo sent letters and voter registration cards in June to more than 50,000 Oregonians who will be turning 18 before the Nov. 2 General Election.
