"I don't care what you do in creating an outstanding high school program if kids entering the school are so far below benchmark that they're not academically prepared," said

He sites continuing an emphasis on education from preschool or Head Start programs to middle school and parental involvement as contributing factors to success in high school.

That's where Hopson says he can help. "We've had success with bringing people together unlike any other group out there. We do a better job of involving kids in activities than anybody else. We do a better job of getting parents involved than Jefferson ever could. If you need to get kids to participate beyond the school day or in school, we can help with that. "But there needs to be a full plan and we need to be given full opportunity to work with administrators and teacher to get that done," he said.

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
