Diversity Valued in the Workplace

But survey shows many employers have poor records

(AP) - Fewer than a third of American workers believe their companies have effective diversity programs, accord-

ing to a new report by the National Urban League.

The report also found that fewer than half of the workers surveyed had favorable opinions of their companies' efforts on recruiting, leadership commitment, and career development.

"We have work to do," said Marc Morial. president and CEO of the League, a New York-based civil rights group. "One of the reasons why this study is important is it gives us a sense of where we are."

that diversity improved creativity workers, where 43 percent thought and innovation in the workplace, and 80 percent said they were comfortable working in diverse ity in outlook between executives teams.

But when asked if their company had an effective diversity program, only 32 percent had a favorable response, while 26 percent had a negative view of their companies' efforts. The rest were neutral.

Those with the most favorable opinions of diversity programs included executives - 47 percent of whom thought their companies were effective - and employees at companies with more than 5,000

While the population of the country has gotten increasingly diverse, American companies haven't kept up, said Fariborz Ghadar, professor of finance and director of the Center for Global Business Studies at Penn State University.
