(AP) - Democrat John Kerry, taking advantage of a spat between the NAACP and the White House, accused President Bush of dividing America by race and wealth, and promised as presi- day. dent to represent "all of the people."

Bush rejected an invitation to address the NAACP. He has not spoken to the civil rights group since the 2000 campaign, when the NAACP National Voter Fund ran an ad that portrayed Bush as unsympathetic to the dragging death of James Byrd in Texas. Since the campaign, leaders of

the NAACP have called Bush an illegal president, compared his anti-abortion views to the Taliban and called his trip to Africa a photo-op. A Bush spokesman blasted the NAACP on Thurs-
