Notice of Public Hearing

The Salem-Keizer Transit District is conducting a public hearing for the purpose of considering changes to its fares and fare policies. The Cherrlots fare structure has not changed since 1994.

The current fares are as follows:

- Adult cash 75 cents Adult monthly pass \$20
- Youth cash 50 cents Youth monthly pass \$15
- Seniors/Disabled cash 35 cents Senior/disabled monthly pass \$10
- One-day passes are twice the cash fares.

The Board of Directors will be reviewing several fare options, including leaving fares at their current level, with a minimum of changes in policies; raising the basic cash fare to 85-cents; and raising the basic fare to 1.00. Other options may be considered as well. Staff's proposals for discussion are as follows:

- Option 2**
- Adult cash 85 cents Adult monthly pass \$22
 - Youth cash 60 cents Youth monthly pass \$16
 - Seniors/Disabled cash 40 cents Senior/Disabled monthly pass \$11
 - One-day passes at twice the cash fares

- Option 3**
- Adult cash \$1.00 Adult monthly pass \$24
 - Youth cash 75 cents Youth monthly pass \$18
 - Senior/Disabled cash 50 cents Senior/Disabled monthly pass \$12
 - One-day passes at twice the cash fares

In addition to the basic cash fares, there will also be discussion on, and possible changes to:

- CherryLift fares (currently twice the basic adult fare)
- Route 1X Wilsonville fares (currently fare-free)
- Fare-free events, such as the Art Fair and State Fair
- The size of discounts on monthly bus passes and day passes
- Instituting a pay-as-you-board policy

The public hearing will open on **Thursday, September 23, 2004**, at the District Board meeting. The meeting is at **6:30 pm** in the **Senator Hearing Room, 1st floor of Courthouse Square, 555 Court St. NE, in Salem, OR 97304**. Staff will present an overview of the several fare proposals, and comment from Cherrlot riders and the public is welcome and encouraged.

The hearing will continue to the **Thursday, October 28** Board meeting, also at **6:30 pm** in the **Senator Hearing Room, 1st floor of Courthouse Square, 555 Court St. NE, in Salem**. The board will take further public testimony at the hearing, and then work toward a decision on fare policies and changes, if any, should be made to the current fares. If fares changes and new policies are approved, they would be implemented no earlier than January 2005.

The public is invited to provide input at either or both hearing dates. Written comments may be sent to Salem-Keizer Transit, suite 5230, at the above address, or emailed to the District (sat@cherrlots.org), and will be accepted for the record up to the final October 28, 2004 hearing date. NOTICE is hereby given that the PORT OF KALAMA will be receiving SEALED BIDS for the construction of a pre-engineered building system at the Port of Kalama. Bids will be opened at the Port office located at 380 W. Marine Drive, Kalama, WA 98625 at 10:00 AM, October 4, 2004.

The project will include, among other things, site work and the erection of a 30,000 square foot pre-purchased, pre-engineered metal building with 1,500 square feet of office building attached. The General Contractor is to furnish all labor, materials, and equipment necessary for the construction of the project as described in the bid document package. The Contractor's work will include: all site work, concrete work, erection of the pre-purchased metal building package, electrical service, plumbing, lighting, sanitary sewer, interior and exterior finishes, thermal and moisture control, heating cooling and ventilation, doors, windows, and incidental related work.
