Trans-Siberian Orchestra's highly-anticipated new album has made an impressive mark by debuting No. 26 on Billboard Top 200 Album Chart and No. 1 on the Christian Album Chart.

The album, titled *The Lost Christmas Eve*, is the first studio album of new material in four years.

One of music's most exhilarating live bands, the album includes 23 new tracks and features its signature fusion of rock, classical, Broadway and R & B, which has made it an American phenomenon with fans of all ages.

Established in 1996 by producer, composer and lyricist Paul O'Neill, Trans-Siberian Orchestra has crafted inspirational music and delivered compelling live performances during their short time together.

TSO has become a holiday essential amongst music lovers. Their epic song "Christmas Eve/Sarajevo 12/24," inspired by the true story of a cellist who refused to be intimidated by the gunfire in his native city of Sarajevo, has become one of the most requested songs to be played on radio during the holiday season.

More than 150,000 tickets have already been sold for the group's upcoming North American tour.



In Loving Memory Of Albert Scott Sr.

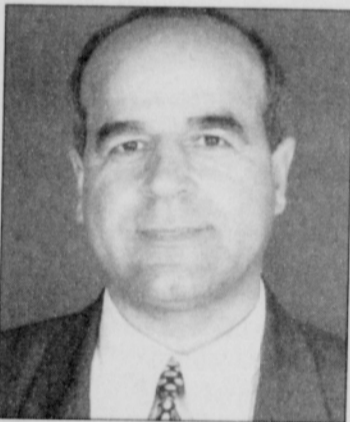

Portland Community College's International Education Week will go global with a Muslim keynote speaker from the West Bank.

PCC welcomes Fulbright Scholar Samir Abu Znaid, dean at the school of finance and management and also vice president for academic affairs at the Hebron University in Hebron, West Bank, to the week-long event from Nov. 15-19.

Church Bulldozed in Attack

(AP) — A man was arrested on vandalism charges after police said he drove a bulldozer into a Vicksburg, Miss. church, an attack parishioners claim was racially motivated.

Zane Bearrick, 21, was arrested and charged with felony malicious mischief, Detective Todd Dykes said. The bulldozer early Saturday struck the trailer that housed the First Assembly of Yaweh Vicksburg.

The church has a black congregation and the suspect is white. Church members said they suspect the act was racially motivated and have asked the FBI to investigate.

The bulldozer was parked 100 yards behind the trailer.

A person can receive up to five years in prison and a \$10,000 fine if convicted of malicious mischief. A hate-crime conviction on the same charge in the state could result in a 10-year prison term and a \$20,000 fine.
