The University of Portland men's basketball team is home this week for games Thursday and Sunday after a weekend road loss to Santa

Some African Americans do not perceive the gay fight for equality as on par with the black civil rights movement. Yet many same-sex marriage advocates feel their "separate but equal" treatment has parallels to Jim Crow laws. One of the major opponents of same-sex marriage has been Christian conserva-

"We are in a climate nationally and politically where civil rights for every minority group is under challenge. I'm concerned that we have the growth of a Christian right wing that is motivated by their own religious values and a conservative agenda that in Oregon, they have silenced moderate voices in our state," said Thorpe. "It's really important to join together with other social justice and economic groups

to prepare for attacks as they come." She adds, "I actually think asking for marriage equality is a very

compromised," Saadat said. According to Alisa Simmons, a board member of Basic Rights Oregon, conversations are needed with church leaders to promote

understanding. "I'm a Christian, so I have to have hope and fight within our churches to have those conversations and have them more honestly," said Simmons, who is an

African-American lesbian. Pastor T. Allen Bethel of Maranatha Church and president of the Albina Ministerial Alliance spoke out against same-sex marriage before the ban passed in No-

"It is definitely not a civil rights issue. If the opponents of (Measure) 36 want to say it's equal to the violations and discrimination against African Americans, there's absolutely no way. Not even close," Bethel, who is African American, said at the time.

For Simmons, the argument is basic, and needs not include intel-

King's teachings have lent inspiration to today's civil rights leaders, who, at this moment in Oregon, feel they are fighting for very basic freedoms.

Sadaat said, "Dr. King was such a great leader because he spoke about unifying us as human beings. The thing I learned from Dr. King is it's really hard to walk your talk but if you want a changed world, you are responsible.'

For Thorpe, King's message may apply well to civil rights fights of the moment, but his words are most valuable when taking in the big picture.

"While the words of Dr. King are perfectly appropriate for what's happening, if we are going to use Dr. King's words, we have to hear what he was saying about a broad vision for this country that has still not been met," said Thorpe
