The Life of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

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• Feb. 1, 1960

The sit-in movement begins at a Woolworth lunch counter in Greensboro, N.C. In an effort to desegregate lunch counters, movies, hotels, libraries, and other segregated facilities, it spreads rapidly throughout the country.

• Oct. 19, 1960

Martin Luther King, Jr. is arrested at a lunch counter in Rich's Department Store, in Atlanta. He refuses to post bail, and goes to jail with student protestors.



• Jan. 30, 1961

Dexter Scott King is born.



• Oct. 16, 1962

Martin Luther King Jr. meets with President Kennedy and urges him to issue a second Emancipation Proclamation to end racial segregation.

• March 28, 1963

Bernice Albertine King is born.

• April 12, 1963

Martin Luther King, Jr. is arrested and jailed during a march in Birmingham, Ala. While in jail, King writes his famous "Letter From Birmingham Jail" explaining the need for non-violent civil disobedience.

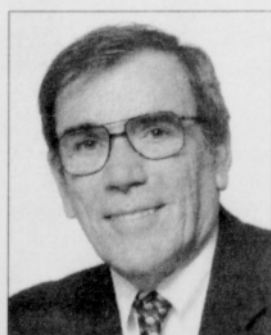
