





Since his first recordings in 1940, B.B. King has released more than 50 albums. many of which are considered blues classics. Over the years, he has had number one R&B hits with "Three O'Clock Blues," and "You Don't Know Me." His classic songs like "Payin' The

Cost To Be The Boss,""Caldonia," "How Blue Can You Get" and "Why I Sing The Blues" are concert and fan staples.

B.B. King was inducted into the Blues Foundation Hall of Fame in 1984 and into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in 1987.
