Jackie Winters Recovers from Heart Surgery

Saying all went well, Sen. Jackie Winters, R-Salem, was released from Salem Hospital on Monday to recover from triple bypass surgery.

Winters will now recover at home where her doctors have told her she will be able to make phone calls and read as she feels up to it. The African-American lawmaker hopes to be back in the Senate in time to vote on bills related to the state budget.

Winters praised both the staff at the hospital and a program called Heart Pillows in her recovery. Pillows made by students and hospital staff are provided to patients to help relieve the pain associated with coughing after heart surgery.

"This pillow became my life support," Winters said.

Martha was previously married to the late Russell Cravens and later married the late Robert B. Ollison.








