With such death and carnage occurring as a result of gun violence, why haven't we heard from the United States Attorney General Gonzales, the highest-ranking law enforcement officer in the country? He is ultimately responsible for enforcing federal laws and implementing policies to prevent

Attorney General Gonzales has only recently replaced John Ashcroft, and perhaps he needs more time to gather a strategy. As such, maybe he is open to some advice from taxpaying Americans. My suggestion is that he convene a national conference on gun violence allowing input from every sector of our country.


