Franklin herself took the helm as producer of the CD. She was particularly proud of the many notable collaborations featured on the disc.

Country and pop star Faith Hill, gospel sensation Smokie Norful and composer Ollie Wilson all make guest appearances on the album.

In a special tribute to late legend Ray Charles, former Temptations lead singer Dennis Edwards joins Franklin for "Friends," a song, that, before he passed away, Charles had requested that Franklin sing.

Franklin's previous album, 2003's "So Damn Happy," on Arista, received a royal reception from fans

In 1987, she was the first woman inducted into the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame and in 1979, Franklin received her star on the Hollywood Walk of
